The four UAPs guide us in: • Showing the way to God • Walking with the excluded • Journeying with youth • Caring for our common home Drawing from Scripture, the Spiritual Exercises, and the writings of luminaries in the Ignatian tradition, including St. Peter Faber, Jerome Nadal, Mark Thibodeaux, William Barry, and Gregory Boyle, this book offers prayers, reflections, and contemplative practices to help us discern, act, and live our lives with spiritual intentionality. Through eight-day prayer octaves, thematic reflections, and Examens, <i>To Set the World on Fire</i> seamlessly integrates the depth, wisdom, and sincerity of the UAPs into daily prayer life.
