






2021-2027 budget for European education programmes

With a separate budget of €26.2 billion for 2021-2027, the new Erasmus+ programme will not only be more inclusive and innovative, but also more digital and greener.

The European Commission has allocated more than €1 billion for the new perspective of the European Solidarity Corps Programme, which will provide at least 270,000 young people with the opportunity to contribute to solving social and humanitarian problems through volunteering or creating their own solidarity projects.










The number of projects in the years 2021-2024 (Erasmus+, ESC and FERS programs)








Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps budgets 2025 | 304,87 (mln EUR)






FRSE budget other projects 2019-2028 | 2,56 billion PLN







Budżet na rok 2024 | funds for operating activities

The European Funds for Social Development (2021 - 2027) is a successor to the Operational Programme Knowledge Education Development (PO WER). The Foundation for the Development of the Education System is one of the beneficiaries of the new program. FDES runs projects supporting, among others: training of vocational education staff, foreign internships for students and graduates of vocational schools, and mobility of disadvantaged students and school education staff.

Individual Development Accounts (IKR) Junior

The aim of the project is to develop a model of operation and test the effectiveness of the system of Individual Development Accounts for children and young people. The project will pilot test support in the area of including children and young people from low-income families in the non-formal learning process.

Estimated project budget: **PLN 109,999,505.00** Implementation period: **1.07.2024 – 31.12.2028**





Transnational educational mobility of pupils and school education staff



European Funds

The aim of the project is to develop and improve the professional or key competences the of teaching staff of educational institutions and pupils (participants with fewer opportunities), through participation in transnational mobility programs implemented under the Erasmus+ program.

Estimated project budget: PLN 113,200,645.54 Implementation period: 1.06.2023 to 31.05.2027





Development of cooperation and coordination in lifelong learning



European Funds

The aim of the project is to develop cooperation and coordination at national and regional level (including interregional cooperation) in the field of lifelong learning, including key stakeholder groups and using existing mechanisms.

Result: reports with recommendations for systemic change.

Project budget: PLN 23,993,838.00

Time period: 01.10.2023 to 31.12.2028

The project is implemented in partnership with the Ministry of the National Education.







European Funds:Peer Support for Youth Mental Health

The main objective of the project will be to develop and test in secondary schools a method of support for students in mental crises, based on peer support, the so-called peer support method.

Estimated project budget: PLN 41,070,480.00 Implementation period: 1.07.2024 to 30.11.2028





International Learning Mobility of Pupils, Graduates and Vocational Education Staff (VET-2)

The aim of the project is to improve the professional or key competences of students and graduates of vocational schools and vocational education and training institutions, as well as staff representatives, through participation in transnational mobility programs implemented under the Erasmus+ program.

Estimated project budget: **223,000,000.00**

Implementation period: **1.06.2025 to 30.11.2029**





WorldSkills Poland

WorldSkills Poland – an initiative encouraging young people to improve their professional skills through the prestigious international WorldSkills and EuroSkills competitions.

#TeamPoland won the medals of excellence at EuroSkills Budapest 2018 (cooking), silver medal at WorldSkills Kazan 2019 (cooking). 3 bronze medals at EuroSkills Graz 2021 (cooking, floristry, welding), bronze medal (integration of industrial robots) and 3 medals of excellence (digital construction/BIM, floristry, industry 4.0) at the WorldSkills Competition 2022 Special Edition.

At **EuroSkills Gdańsk 2023**, Polish Team won 13 medals – 3 gold (CNC milling, robot system integration, electronics), 1 silver (hotel reception), 3 bronze (digital construction, plumbing and heating, heavy vehicle technology) and 6 medals of excellence (welding, cooking, hairdressing, restaurant service, sanitary and heating installations, floristry).









National Recovery and Resilience Plan









The National Recovery and Resilience Plan is a development plan that sets out goals related to the reconstruction and creation of socio-economic resilience of Poland after the crisis related to COVID-19 pandemic. It contains due reforms and investments.

Plan for establishment and support of functioning of 120 Industry Skills Centres, implementing the concept of Centres of Vocational Excellence. Plan for establishment of the system of Coordination and monitoring of regional activities for vocational education, higher education and lifelong learning, including adult learning





National Recovery and Resilience Plan:

Establishment and support of functioning of 120 Industry Skills Centres, implementing the concept of centres of vocational excellence (CoVEs)

The aim of the Projects selected within Call is support for preparing staff for the needs of the modern economy in specific industries by providing space for innovative and lasting cooperation between business and vocational education at all levels, as well as implementation of the concept of professional excellence in the Polish vocational education system.

Action is carried out as part of A3.1.1 Investment, Support for the development of modern vocational education, higher education and lifelong learning.

Project budget: **PLN 1,429,000,000.00** divided into 122 areas with allocation from PLN 9,000,000.00 to PLN 16,000,000.00

Time period: to 30.06.2026







National Recovery and Resilience Plan:

Coordination and monitoring activities for vocational education, higher education and lifelong learning, including adult learning

The aim of the project is to build a system for coordinating activities in regions aimed at supporting vocational education, higher education and lifelong learning, including adult learning, even better adaptation of education to the labor market and promotion of lifelong learning.

The project is implemented within the Investment A3.1.1. Support for the development of modern vocational education, higher education and lifelong learning.

Project budget: PLN 344,000,000.00

Time period: to 30.06.2026

Regional Information Points are units which goal is to promote EU education programmes in all regions of Poland, especially in smaller towns which have not yet benefited from programmes with such opportunities as Erasmus+ and the European Solidarity Corps.






