Background

About Us: Civic Strength Partners helps social change organizations plan strategically for organizational succession, mergers and partnerships, and protection of assets. We preserve the lessons, tools, and relationships that drive the mission and impact of development organizations globally.

When civil society organizations face complex transitions – a merger, strategic partnership, or wind-down – we work closely with leadership to navigate change with clarity and care. We offer trusted guidance, tailored advice, and access to the people and infrastructure that preserve what matters most, protect legacy, and position the organization for what's next. Over time, this strengthens a resilient, community-led ecosystem that supports the whole sector.

Our Story: Over half of the respondents to a February 2025 survey we carried out with partners reported that their organizations were considering restructuring, merging, or closing in the next 3-6 months, largely in response to the unexpected stop work orders (SWOs) announced by the US government. While this exact challenge is new, it is part of a broader trend of disruptions to non-profit work that has occurred in recent years, from the COVID-19 pandemic to reductions in bilateral assistance from many European donors, to strategic pivots of philanthropic funders.

Since March, we've heard from 150+ organizations interested in mergers, strategic partnerships, or other transformations. Yet currently, there is no international, shared, Global South-facing facility to support mergers, partnerships, sunsets, project handoffs, and other organizational alignment processes.

That is why Accountability Lab, Development Gateway: An IREX Venture, and Digital Public have joined forces to create Civic Strength Partners, a partnership matching service and support network for organizations navigating moments of change.

Our Impact:

We have created a shared fund, with the support of six donors, of approximately \$1,200,000 to support organizational partnerships.

We have a pooled fund of expertise to provide technical support across contexts and jurisdictions (legal, human resources, organizational change management, etc.) and a

dedicated team to triage, match-make, and accompany these processes.

At the moment, more than pairs of organizations are working towards solutions, with another 15 pairs in the pipeline, and receive 2-5 new requests for support every day.

Our services include archiving or legacy plans for data and knowledge products, succession and sustainability strategies, and tactical, legal, and digital resilience measures. CSP believes that in all cases, the process can be done with care, integrity, and responsibility — ensuring that knowledge, people, and communities are not left behind.
