ON THE WAY TO GLORY: HORSES AND RIDERS READY FOR THE ROLEX GRAND PRIX PRESENTED BY AUDI Rolex Series, Brussels 30 August, 2025

BRUSSELS STEPS INTO THE SPOTLIGHT AHEAD OF THE **ROLEX GRAND PRIX PRESENTED BY AUDI**

The 2025 Brussels Stephex Masters, the final event of the Rolex Series 2025, has once again underlined its reputation as one of the most prestigious venues in international show jumping. With its unique blend of elegance, energy, and top-level sport, the Grand Place Arena has already delivered home triumphs, and world-class performances in the lead-up to Sunday's Rolex Grand Prix presented by Audi.

Thursday opened with the CSIO5* presented by Equihome (1.50m - Table

A against the clock), the first qualifier for the Rolex Grand Prix presented by Audi. In a class that saw 15 clear rounds and an electrifying jump-off, Great Britain's Ben Maher and his trusted mare Ginger-Blue proved untouchable, clinching victory in a lightning-fast 66.05 seconds. Belgian hero Jérôme Guery and Careca LS Elite delighted the home crowd with second place in 67.93, while Omar Abdul Aziz Al Marzooqi (UAE) and Chacco Bay claimed third in 68.44. Friday was a day of double highlights. In the afternoon, the spotlight turned

to the CS/O5* Henders and Hazel Nations Cup presented by STX Finance (1.60m), the second qualifier for Sunday's Grand Prix. Ten nations lined up in the opening round, with only eight advancing to the decisive second. In

front of an electric crowd, Team France emerged victorious with a total of just 4 penalties, followed by **Belgium** (9) and **Switzerland** (12), after a gripping contest that went down to the very last rider. The evening brought further excitement with the CSIO5* presented by Stephex Horsetrucks (1.55m - Table A with Jump-Off), another crucial qualifier for the Rolex Grand Prix presented by Audi. From a field of 11 jump-off contenders, Swiss superstar Steve Guerdat (Rolex testimonee)

and Lancelotta stole the show, stopping the clock in 36.33 to secure the win. Belgian rider Emilie Conter produced a brilliant double clear at home to take second, while Olympic bronze medallist Cian O'Connor (IRL)

and Canbella Blue PS rounded out the podium. With world-class sport already on display throughout the week, the stage is perfectly set for Sunday's Rolex Grand Prix presented by Audi — the thrilling climax of the 2025 Rolex Series.

THE PHILIPPAERTS BROTHERS ON THE BRUSSELS STEPHEX MASTERS: "A SHOW WE CAN BE PROUD OF"

For Belgian riders Nicola and Olivier Philippaerts, the Brussels Stephex Masters a Rolex series event is far more than a competition - it is a landmark event that has shaped their careers and their sport.

Nicola remembers the early days: "The first time I went to Brussels was many years ago, for the very first edition at Stéphane Conter's home. From the start, it was a fantastic show, and it has improved so much over the years that it has become one of the biggest events in the world. To have something like this in Belgium, I think we can be really honoured." Olivier reflects on how far the event has come: "From the beginning it was

already an exceptional experience, but especially in the last two years, when we all moved to the big grass arena with the full stadium, I think the

show has reached the next level. Today it truly ranks among the best in the world, and I can see it continuing for the next 15-20 years as one of the sport's greatest events." For Nicola, the magic lies in the atmosphere: "The event is a true experience. There are so many classes, so much atmosphere, and the

highest level of sport. Anybody can come — young people, older people —

it's a real family event." Olivier agrees, highlighting its originality: "If you have to explain the Brussels Stephex Masters, it's a very unique experience, but also a very

new concept. It's something we had never seen before in our sport, and

that's what makes it so special."

As they prepare to shine in front of their home crowd, Nicola and Olivier agree on one point: the Brussels Stephex Masters has grown into an event that Belgium — and the entire sport of show jumping — can be proud of.
